

Instruction for presentations

We have three distinct categories of contributions, and we have tailored presentation formats to each type. Below are the three categories and their respective presentation options:

Educational Innovation Showcase & Hyperposters - Presentation Instructions

Teaching and learning methodologies and techniques

Curriculum development

Student contributions and outcome reporting in theoretical and problem-based courses

Each presentation at the conference is unique. To ensure the ideal environment for you to share your insights, we offer two types of presentation formats: the Standard Presentation and the Teaching Experiment. Select the format that best suits your material and approach. Whether you opt for a structured slide-based presentation or an interactive teaching experiment, your goal should be to effectively convey your insights and engage with the audience. Below are the specific guidelines for each;

1. Standard Presentation

- **Duration:** The presentation should be 8 minutes long, followed by a 10-minute discussion period facilitated by the session chair.
- **Slides:** Use the official templates and recommendations provided for your slides. The templates will be provided by the first week of September.
- **Content Structure:** Your slide deck should contain no more than 10 slides, covering these essential sections:
 - Motivation
 - Key Discovery or Challenge
 - Key Insight or Solution
 - Key Learning
 - Key Recommendation

2. Teaching Experiment

- **Duration:** This format consists of a 20-minute interactive session where you showcase, simulate, and demonstrate in practice your insights. By facilitating a workshop, or creating the classroom environment of your teaching methodology or technique. This will be followed by a 10-minute discussion period.
- **Participation:** Expect active participation from the audience, who may assume roles such as students or other characters relevant to the teaching scenario you build.
- **Purpose:** This format is particularly suited for showcasing innovative teaching and learning methodologies. You are encouraged to choose this format if it aligns better with your presentation's theme. Use this opportunity to display part of your methodology or approach and receive feedback.
- **Slides:** Please use the official cover slide template of your presentation and have a look at our recommendations, this will be provided by the first week of September.

Themed storytelling sessions - Presentation Instructions

These contributions will be presented in a “*fishbowl*” format, namely a dynamic discussion format rather than a typical presentation. It involves authors of selected contributions discussing their ideas in a semi-circle setup. To foster inclusivity and active participation, two chairs within the circle will always remain vacant, inviting audience members to join the discussion at any point.

- **Facilitation:** Each session will be guided by the content curation team or an invited expert.
- **Preparation:** Unlike traditional presentations, you do not need to prepare slides or any physical deliverables.
- **Participation:** The focus is on lively, spontaneous discussions. Authors are encouraged to drive the conversation, with two seats continually open for audience members to contribute to the dialogue.
- **Documentation:** A designated student champion will document the key points from the discussion. These insights will be compiled and shared with all participants after the event, ensuring that valuable ideas and exchanges are captured and disseminated.
